

Equestrian rider will compete again

Promising young horse rider, 19 year old Lauren Dolan's aspirations of becoming a top horse rider were unexpectedly interrupted when she was seriously injured at a horse competition. However, thanks to the emergency response from the Lowe Corporation Rescue Helicopter, Lauren's career aspirations will soon be back on track.

Lauren was at a competition near Takapau at the Arran Station Horse Trials. After a thorough warm-up, and as Lauren was about to enter the arena to compete, her horse unexpectedly bucked and dislodged Lauren, and lashing out with its' hind feet and kicked Lauren in the face.

The seriousness of Lauren's injuries was immediately obvious so the helicopter was called through 111. Once airborne Chief Pilot Charlie Beetham took just 18 minutes to fly to Takapua and deliver Intensive Care Paramedic Ryan Sutherland to the scene. Lauren was quickly assessed and treated by Ryan, then immediately flown to Hawke's Bay Hospital's Emergency Department in Hastings for further assessment and initial treatment.

Several hours later the Rescue Helicopter was called once more to transport Lauren from Hawke's Bay Hospital to Hutt Hospital for specialist care of her facial wounds. X-rays revealed that Lauren had 54 bone fractures – 53 of these in her face and one broken collar bone.

Thanks to some amazing work by some very talented maxillofacial surgeons Lauren's face is unmarked, so she bears no lasting scars from her ordeal.

Lauren's recovery has been slow with several surgeries along the way, but her equestrian career will continue, she is not deterred by the incident so will soon be back and riding. As Lauren says "I started horse riding at 3 years old, so I know that this accident was just one of those things along the way" She is determined to pursue her dreams of becoming a top horse rider.

Of her two trips in the helicopter - Lauren says "I don't remember any of this but I am incredibly grateful to the Lowe Corporation Rescue Helicopter for the service I received. I would not have made the recovery that I have without the rescue helicopter".

All of the team at the Rescue helicopter wish Lauren every success as she pursues her equestrian dreams.

Your Award-Winning Rescue Helicopter Service

The Hawke's Bay Rescue Helicopter Trust, LandSAR Hawke's Bay and NZ Police Search and Rescue have been recognised as 'real-life heroes', receiving a Certificate of Achievement at the New Zealand Search and Rescue (NZSAR) Council Awards.

The honour, presented at Parliament on May 10th 2017, was for their efforts rescuing two trampers caught in deteriorating weather in the Ruahine Ranges on October 5 2016.

Experienced trampers from Tolaga Bay, Clive Cresswell, 59, and his wife Marie, a 53-year-old nurse at Te Puia Springs Hospital, had found themselves in urgent need of local rescue services while on a tramp in the Ruahine Ranges.

While walking along a ridge at 1500m altitude, the pair were suddenly exposed to bitterly cold weather conditions as freezing mist and violent hailstones closed in. At 2pm, with Marie showing signs of hyperthermia, they activated their Personal Locator Beacon (PLB), and waited for help to arrive.

The National Search and Rescue Co-ordination Centre, based in Wellington picked up their PLB signal, and the Rescue Helicopter – piloted by Jeremy Bruce - was responded to their location to recover them. But with high winds, low cloud and deteriorating light affecting visibility, the crew were unable to reach the Cresswells. A LANDSAR ground team was then dispatched from Hawke's Bay Search and Rescue, and managed to locate the stranded couple at 3am.

Later that morning, the group tried to walk out of the ranges, but the terrain proved impossible to traverse and the helicopter was called again - this time Piloted by Charlie Beetham along with volunteer crew member Brett How and Wayne Steed from NZ Police - to fly the Cresswells back to their vehicle.

"The survival of the two trampers would have been significantly compromised without the professional skills, teamwork, perseverance and courage of the rescue teams" the NZSAR Council said.

"When the attempt to walk to safer ground was no longer an option, the skill and courage of the helicopter crew in challenging flying conditions facilitated a safe recovery"

Searching for, and rescuing people is a complex, often difficult task that occurs in all kinds of weather and usually in demanding locations. The people who work or volunteer their time and skills in this area, and those who support them, often receive little public recognition for the feats they achieve and the sustained effort they put in to accomplish these tasks.

In recognition of this, the New Zealand Search and Rescue (NZSAR) Council established an annual national award programme to acknowledge worthy achievements in the field of search and rescue in the New Zealand Search and Rescue Region.

Pilot Charlie Beetham, along with Volunteer Crewman Brett How, accepted the award at the formal awards ceremony on Wednesday 10th May.

"We are amazed and humbled to be accepting this award along with our colleagues in the Police and Land SAR, because to us, we were just doing our job" Charlie said.

We are very proud of this as it is a great example of cooperation

between the emergency services of Hawke's Bay, the Fire Service, Police, Rescue Helicopter and LANDSAR. Thank you to everyone involved.

Winter Missions Snapshot

Date: 14th April

Time: 13.30

Rescue from a Ship: Received a tasking from the Rescue Coordination Centre to winch recover a male in his 60s from a ship that was conducting a seismic survey 50nm off the coast from Cape Kidnappers. The crew winched a St John Intensive Care Paramedic to the bow of the ship to first attend the patient. The patient and paramedic were then winched back into the helicopter and flown to Hawke's Bay.

Date: 24th April 2017

Time: 7.00

Rescue of a Tramper: A call out for a tramper in his 30s who had sustained a knee injury at Mangateinoke Hot Springs at the Mohaka River. He was hover loaded into the helicopter on a nearby bend in the river and transported to Hawke's Bay Hospital for further treatment.





Date: 26th April 2017 Time: 12.00

Quad Bike Rollover: The rescue helicopter responded to a farm near Porangahau for a male in his 60s who had an accident with a quad bike while driving down a steep hill.

Date: 25th May

Time: 11.00

Medical Transfer: A baby boy was transported to Wellington's Hutt Hospital suffering from burns.

Date: 4th June 2017

Time: 15.30

PLB activation: A group of jet boats were located on a river bed after one of the boats had flipped in shallow water injuring two males. A 26 year old sustained back injuries. Both were transported by the Rescue Helicopter to Hawke's Bay Hospital for further treatment
